NEW YORK LETTER

NEW YORK, Oct. 22.—"The time has come to stop the unjust attacks on honest business," declares Senator Beveridge in Appleton's Magazine for November. "There is enough law now to end the evils of big business and some of the laws already in existence result in business oppression. These hampering conditions can be corrected by amending the interstate commerce law, the Sherman law and the present tariff."

To pass laws giving the government further inquisitorial powers would not only discourage business activity, but would dangerously increase the possibilities of the abuse of power by the federal government, in the opinion of Senator Beveridge. This, he holds, would be particularly true of the so-called franchise plan, by which corporations would be forbidden to control more than 25 per cent of the business in any one industry except under special license from the executive department of the government, or more than 50 per cent in any case.

"Suppose a concern deals exclusively in eggs—as several concerns now do," says Senator Beveridge. "How could the government tell whether that concern was buying and selling more than 25 per cent of all the eggs laid by all the hens in the country? Fifty thousand government egg agents, constantly at work questioning all the farmers' wives as to how many eggs their hens laid every day could not tell the President whether an egg franchise should be granted. Under such a plan even the hens would quit in disgust."

KING'S GOOD WISHES.

Extended To An American Episcopal Parish In New York.

NEW YORK, Oct. 22.—Congratulations by cable from King Edward, added distinction to the bi-centennial of St. Andrews Protestant Episcopal Church of Richmond, Staten Island. The cablegram read: "To the bishop of New York: I am commanded by the King to express his gratification for the tribute you are paying to his ancestor, Queen Anne, and the hope that the same providence that has followed St. Andrews Church for the past 200 years may continue for the years to come."

A thousand people and several church dignitaries attended special service at the church.

The church was chartered by Queen Anne of England in 1706, having been established for six years prior to this as a missionary church. The original communion service, altar cloth and bible installed in the church at its organization are still used in the service.

Following an address by bishop Greer, two tablets in honor of Queen Anne and the original twelve founders of the church were unveiled.
