LORD MILNER MAKES AN IM-PRESSIVE APPEAL FOR IMPERIALISM

IS THE ONE GREAT ISSUE

The Next Few Years Are Going To Determine Whether Canada Will Remain A Part Of The British Empire," Titled Visitor Says.

MONTREAL, Nov. 5 .- Lord Milner made the last speech he will make in Canada during his present stay in the Dominion, to the Canadian club yesterday. It was ,he said, an appeal to imperialism of the higher type. He said in part:

"There is one remark that I have often heard from Canadians, not from Englishmen, and that is that the publie life in Canada is unattractive because there are no big issues. That seems to me to be an extraordinary point of view. No big issues! The next few years are going to determine whether Canada will remain a part of the British empire. The decision of that question rests with Canadians alone. No exterminal compulsion could be, certainly none ever would be exercised to influence it. It rests with them alone—the decision of that question, and with that question perhaps the decision of the fate of the empire as a whole. Even in its badly organized condition the empire was the greatest political entity in the world; properly orgnized it would

be the greatest power. "It lies with all parts of the empire know how or where. Most likely it shall be capable of discharging its Lewis & Clark, Astoria.
