FINE BIG SWITCHBOARDS FOR ASTORIA

OFFICIALS ARRIVE ON ROANOKE—INSPECT THE NEW BUILDINGS.

General Superintendent of Plants D. S. Murray, and Chief Engineer C. W. Burkett, of the Pacific States Telephone Company, arrived in this city yesterday from San Francisco, on the steamship Roanoke. The gentlemen came for the express purpose of inspecting the new building just completed for the company on Exchange street, and to make arrangements for its early and final acceptance. They are very much pleased with the structure, its style, character and the workmanship put upon Messrs. Ferguson & Houston, the contractors; and it will, in all likelihood be turned over to the company well within the time prescribed. Messrs. Murray and Burkett are also much pleased with the prospect of being able to keep full faith with the Astoria public in all its engagements as to the improvements and expansion promised, and to emphasize this pleasant outlook, brought with them on the steamer, the new and modern switchboard for the station.

This fine new adjunct is adapted for the ready accommodation of 1200 subscribers, and may be quickly increased to cover the range of business demanded by 4000 subscribers, as time, and the growth of the company's commerce, shall make such changes necessary. The same rule of development applies to the new edifice on Exchange street; the spaces there are so planned as to meet the requirements of the business for the next ten years, and all the apparatus will be served with that end in view. And by January 1st, next, the company will have kept its word with Astoria and put the whole new system into effective operation.

It is also making good on the promised increase in the long distance facilities between this city and Portland, doubling the service. They have the new circuits already erected as far as Goble, coming this way, and there is all the material on the ground for closing the gap, and this will be done simultaneously with the opening up of the new local work on New Year's Day, or immediately thereafter.
