MRS. READ VERY ILL.

Woman Who Attempted Extortion Can't Even Attend Court.

DENVER, Colo., Nov. 21.—Mrs. Allen F. Read, who attempted to extort \$20,000 from Mrs. Genevieve Chandler Phipps with the aid of dynamite, will not appear in court today to answer to the charge against her as previously arranged.

The physician attending her states that the condition of Mrs. Read is precarious, due to hemorrhages.

Mrs. Read's bond was reduced from \$3,000 to \$1,500 yesterday, but even this amount was not forthcoming.

Mrs. Read's attorney told the court that her condition was serious and that there was no danger that she would leave the jurisdiction of the court and that it might be two months before she would be able to appear in court.

CHINESE SEND CONSUL WITH THANKS

CELESTIAL NATION IS GRATEFUL FOR REMISSION OF BOXER INDEMNITY

MOURNING IN SAN FRANCISCO

For This Reason There Will be Little Pomp and Oriental Pageantry to Mark Arrival of the Ambassador to This Nation.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 21.—Because of the mourning prescribed for the death of the emperor of China and the empress dowager, there will be little of Oriental pomp and pageantry in the reception of Tong Chao Yi, who will arrive tomorrow on the steamer Mongolia en route for Washington, where he will convey to the president the thanks of the Chinese empire for remitting a portion of the Boxer indemnity. San Francisco's Chinese colony has just begun observance of the proclamation received by Consul Hau Ping Chen, and while officials must observe the rigorous code for 100 days, the least of the emperor's subjects must manifest outward evidence of grief for 27 days.

Original plans for the official reception by federal and state authorities will, however, be carried out. Collector of the Port F. A. Stratton will be represented by two deputies who will expedite the landing of the commissioner and his large suite; Capt. E. F. Donnelly of Washington will assume charge of the visitors' safety, and there will be an escort of troops from the steamer dock to the Fairmont hotel.

WANT TARIFF KEPT.

SALT LAKE, Utah, Nov. 21.—To voice their protest against any reduction in the tariff on lead a mass meeting of Utah mine owners last night delegated C. E. Loose of Provo and C. E. Allen of Salt Lake to appear before the ways and means committee at Washington. The meeting was held at the Commercial Club and under the auspices of the Utah Mine Owners' Association. The circulation for signatures of a petition against the reduction of duty was authorized by the meeting.

NEW YORK, Nov. 21.—Herbert Cosman's teeth grew up instead of down and for that reason he is a patient at St. Luke's hospital here today. An operation has been performed, however, which is believed to have been successful and Cosman's rapid recovery with his mouth restored to its normal condition is expected.
