"BATTLING" NELSON IS NOT PROSECUTED

GOES FREE FROM HIS PART
IN THE SAVAGE BULL-
DOG FIGHT.

REQUIRED WITNESS ABSENT

But When the Prize Fighter Tries
to do Some Business With a Set
of Railway Men He Doesn't Even
Know the Rules.

CHICAGO, Nov. 25.—Nelson, the prize fighter, and general manager of the town of Hegewisch, won one fight yesterday and lost another. In a police court in Burnham, where he was accused of resisting a policeman, he won. But in the one with the local transportation committee of the city council he lost. There were men on that committee who could talk all around him, and the lightweight was simply outclassed.

The committee went to Hegewisch to look over the proposed right of way for the Kensington and Eastern Railway by which the Illinois Central hopes to get an entrance into Gary. It would pass through Hegewisch and the aldermen drove there in carriages from Pullman. They were met by Mr. Nelson, fresh from his discharge in the Burnham police court.

"Glad to meet you, gentlemen," he exclaimed. "I have got a hall over here where we can go and settle the question at once."

Chairman Foreman looked, dazed but said nothing. Attorney John Drennan, for the Illinois Central, gave indications of wishing the Burnham justice had sentenced Nelson for life.

"Yes," went on Nelson, "we people down here want that road bad. We have no direct connections with the city now and this would give us one. It would raise the price of real estate, and I own some lots here. Let's go over and fix it up."

Alderman Egan tried to explain to the representative of the interests of Hegewisch that the road needed at least a permit and that ordinance would be much better.

Nelson gave evidence of disappointment and he began to express his opinion on the situation and the alderman got into their carriages and departed.

Nelson was arraigned at Burnham in connection with an attack made on Village Clerk T. J. Kulman, when a raid was made on the town hall where a dog fight was in progress. He was not accused of taking part in the slugging, the charges against him being disorderly conduct and resisting an officer. Trustee Julius Smith, the prosecuting witness, was in Milwaukee on his honeymoon and the case was dismissed.
