

# The Daily Market Report

PORTLAND, Dec. 2.—Hens and chickens were quoted half a cent over yesterday's prices in the front street market, and there was a decided improvement in the trade. For both ducks and geese there was the usual moderate demand, but with no change in quotations. There was practically no inquiry for turkeys.

The egg market was very firm, both on locals and Easterns. Receipts of the former were 130 cases.

**Hay Market Holds Its Own.**

Hay dealers report the market on the whole strong, with stocks on hand for the time sufficient for current requirements, but with nothing in sight to indicate any weakening. Last week's quotations on all grades still prevail.

**Dressed Meats Fairly Active.**

Supplies of country dressed meats are coming in just about sufficient quantities for the current demand, and the market in all lines is steady at the prices that have ruled for some time.

**Apple Prices Lowered Again.**

Some of the front-street dealers made another general cut in apple prices today, quoting the fruit at 50 cents to \$1.25 a box and reporting a much better trade as a consequence. Receipts of all sorts continue heavy, and some varieties that cannot be depended upon to keep long are being worked off as fast as possible.

**Fancy Oranges in Good Demand.**

Fruit dealers report the best grade oranges moving actively at \$2.75 to \$3.25 a box generally, while poor quality fruit that was picked too early to mature properly drags at lower prices, some of the sour fruit even selling as low as \$2.25.
