WASHINGTON, Dec. 17. - By unanimous vote the House today adopted a resolution presented by a special committee of five calling on the president for proof of his charge that members are fearful of investigation by the secret service. The committee submitted its report and recommendation immediately after the House convened. The remainder of the day was given over to consideration of bills on the private calendar, a large number of which were passed.
