The Daily Market Report

PORTLAND, Dec. 21.—Trade on Front street was of unusually small proportions today. Saturday is always a more or less quiet day, for the retailers generally are not in the market to buy to any great extent, but the traffic was exceptionally light today, and the bulk of the trade was with the peddlers and fruit stand operators.
At many of the whole fruit stores the customary sidewalk displays were wanting, having been taken inside to protect them against frost and snow, and in some quarters the street wore a holiday appearance. In all lines yesterday's prices prevailed, and business men said there was not enough doing to warrant any changes in quotations.
Receipts from the South included five cars of bananas and one each of oranges and sweet potatoes, but only a small portion of the stuff was unloaded on the street. More oranges are coming early next week, so the chances are that there will be plenty of this fruit, and bananas also, for the holiday trade. But after Christmas the supply of bananas will probably be small, in view of the determination of the wholesale dealers to bring in small shipments hereafter.
