

# The Daily Market Report

**PORTLAND, Dec. 24**—While some of the city creamery men say butter stocks are working off in a satisfactory manner, others regard the situation as a trifle weaker, and this view is shared by most of the dealers in country creamery products, who say that stocks are beginning to pile up. The turkey supply proved somewhat more than sufficient for the Christmas demand. Trade for the holiday came to an end today, and while most of the front street dealers cleaned up their stocks, a few did not, and it was reported that there would be a material surplus left on retailers' hands.
