

The Daily Market Report

PORTLAND, Feb. 5.—The downward movement in the egg market continues, but there is a possibility that it may be halted in the near future. On the street today 40 cents was generally the top quotation on Oregon, and there were reports of sales under that figure as well as slightly above it. The market showed weakness, and there will in all probability be something of a surplus to carry over to next week.

Some dealers hold that when present supplies of Eastern and California eggs are out of the way the market will show a steadier tone, and that the downward movement will then be arrested, for a time at least. Receipts of Eastern and California eggs the past month were actually light as compared with arrivals of outside eggs at some other times of the year, but they were purchased at figures that made high prices at this end necessary, and these extreme prices restricted consumption, so that relatively small quantities of eggs the past few weeks proved as heavy a load for the market as far greater stocks at other times.
