Onions and Potatoes Quieter. The week closes with a slightly easier feeling in the onion and potato trade, and with business more or less generally held in check for the time. Shipments of potatoes south for the week probably aggregated 25 to 30 cars, and the Southern markets are said to be fairly well supplied for the present. Dealers today quoted \$1:25 to \$1.30 to growers for fancy stock.

Butter Is Firm; Eggs Steady. Butter makers report the current make short of requirements and the \$1.50 dozen. outlook is for light production and a firm market for some weeks. Two prices are still quoted by the city creameries, but a uniform quotation is likely to be made soon.

The egg market held steady today, and the prospect was for a clean-up of stocks on the street. The bulk of the day's trade was reported at prices around 224 cents, but in some quar-

ters as high as \$23.4 was quoted. There were no developments in the cheese market. Supplies are still very light and the demand strong.
