

The Daily Market Report

PORTLAND, March 9.—The supply of cream, and consequently that of butter, is steadily increasing, and it is now but a matter of a short time when production will equal the demand.

These continue very firm at the last quotations, with the supply in all quarters short.

There is little doubt that the egg market will go to the 20-cent level before the end of the week. Liberal arrivals were reported by the trade today, and the attitude of the retailers was not such as to inject any strength into the market.
