

# The Daily Market Report

PORTLAND, May 7.—The improvement that has taken place in the hide market within the past week or two is indicated by the advance in quotations on several lines given out by the trade today. No. 1 dry hides are raised half a cent over the quotations of the past month, and No. 1 dry kip a full cent. Salted steers and cows are also up approximately a cent a pound. Other sorts show but little change for the time, but the market on the whole is in good shape.

The mohair season is practically at an end, but small scattering lots of hair are coming to market from time to time, and for these dealers are paying generally from 23 to 25 cents a pound, though it is claimed by some that as the market stands today the best mohair is not worth more than 24 cents.


