TWENTY WORDS OR LESS, ONE WEEK FIFTY CENTS PAYABLE IN ADVANCE

PORTLAND, May 14.—Following an advance of 2 cents a pound which took place on Tuesday of this week, butter makers today announced a further 2-cent lift, putting standard butter up to 28 cents a pound, the highest price known here at this time, for years. There is a possibility, however, of a reaction and lower prices within the next few weeks.

A decidedly strong demand north for butter for the Alaska market and the fact that Coast supplies for the time appear to be actually short of requirements are responsible for the present sharp rise in the market. The first large shipments from Puget Sound to the Far North will leave about the first of June, and to make up these consignments Sound dealers have been buying freely, yet have not been able to get the quantities they need.

At the prices that have ruled for the past few weeks it was impossible to bring in butter from the East. Now, with local prices 4 cents higher than at the first of the week, the situation is changed materially, and the chances are that considerable Eastern butter will be brought in shortly for the Puget Sound and Alaska markets. That the Coast markets will weaken somewhat upon the arrival of large quantities of Eastern butter and the subsidence of the Alaska demand is quite possible, but in this connection it must be remembered that production will then be on the decline to some extent, while at the same time the ice cream season will be on.

At this time in 1905 standard city creamery butter was selling at 20 cents a pound in the wholesale market, and the following year at the same figure. In May, 1907, the price was 22 1/2 cents, and at this time in 1908 the prevailing price was 24 cents. Butter now, therefore, is worth 4 cents a pound more than at this time a year ago and 8 cents more than at the same date in the year of the Lewis and Clark fair.
