

One Source of Wealth.

The wool clip of Eastern Oregon the present year is immense and will increase until like Australia, its wool product will yield more gold than her mines. Many of the cattle men of Eastern Oregon are disposing of their stock and purchasing large flocks of sheep. As yet men's rights are observed; that is, if a man takes a flock of sheep upon a certain range, those who follow respect his right of priority and move onto other ranges. In time these ranges will be entered and cut down in size the bunch grass will be killed out, and owners will be compelled to care for flocks in a similar manner to the farmers of this valley. Sheep kill out bunch grass in a few years, but a fine tender grass springs up in its place, which furnishes excellent range. The cattle men and the sheep men do not dwell together in unity, as cattle will not range with sheep, the latter eating the grass close to the ground and causing the herders to exchange frontier complements, oftentimes in sundry and divers ways. For years to come there will be fortunes made on the bunch grass hills of Eastern Oregon Washington and Idaho, but the time will come when the stock men will be compelled to migrate or turn their attention otherwise. The last steamer from this port took away almost \$200,000 worth of wool and still it accumulates daily at this point. Last evening the steamer Wide West brought down seven hundred bales, and thousands more are waiting to be forwarded to this port at various points along the Upper Columbia. The yield of the Willamette valley this season will also be immense, and the farmer who has spare acreage can do no better than to turn it over to a flock of sheep.—Standard.

The Arabian Stallions presented to Ex President Grant by the Sultan of Turkey, have just arrived in Washington and are in charge of Col. J. R. Lovett, owner and driver of the celebrated mare, American Girl. Crowds of horsemen and others are rushing to get a sight of the beautiful animals. "Leopard," one of the great horses, is a dappled grey, six years old, and full grown. "Linden Tree," the other, is a steel grey, five years old, and they are both beauties. The Arabian shoes are a strange specimen of workmanship, made of a heavy flat piece of sheet-iron adjusted to the hoof, with a slight bend to fit it up under the fetlock. The gorgeous trappings are objects of great interest. Offers of \$50 and \$75 have been made for the old shoes, and \$5 each for the nails. These beautiful studs are to be taken to the farm of Gen. Dea, near Washington and kept until the return of their distinguished owner, when we may expect to see the Ex-President handle the ribbons on any evening, driving the finest team in America.

In the Ogden Freeman of the 10th inst. we find the following interesting article, Mr. Villard, the partner of Jay Gould in the Ogden and Portland, Oregon, Railroad, was in Ogden Monday, and after conferring with his chief engineer, Col. Thielsen, instructions were given by telegraph to put three additional parties of surveyors in the field to hurry the location of the road from Walla Walla via the pass north of the Stege road, through the Blue Mountains, and put on a sufficient force to complete the railway from Walla Walla to the Grande Ronde valley in time to transport the fall crops to the seaboard. The purchase of O. S. N. Co's. line from Astoria and Portland to Wallula, and Dr. Baker's railroad from Wallula to Walla Walla was consummated by Gould and Villard. It is also the intention to construct seventy-five miles of track across the lava beds of Snake river immediately, for the purpose of securing the trade of Idaho and Eastern Oregon this season. This road will intersect the Ogden and Montana Railroad near the mouth of Portneuf canyon, and strike directly for the point where the Little and Big Wood rivers make their confluence with Malad river, and from thence it will follow the valley of Camas creek across the Camas Prairie, thence to Boise City. This throws the track near the wonderful rich mines and vast forests of timber of Alturas and Lemhi counties, Idaho.

A HANDSOME STAGE WAGON.—J. F. Brown has received a handsome light wagon made in Sacramento by Pike & Young, to put on his stage line between Camp McDermitt and Canyon City, Oregon. Business on that route is rapidly increasing, and Mr. Brown is determined that the accommodations for passengers shall be first class.—Silver State.

NOT RESTABLE.—The report in circulation that Jay Gould has paid the money for the O. S. N. Company's property and that the same is to be turned over on July 1st, is not founded on any reliable authority. There is a probability that the Company will sell, but it has not been consummated yet.—Standard.

The Daily Bee says, the old Mexican veteran, Gen. Joe Lane, was serenaded last night at the Clarendon, by a large number of his friends together with the Northwestern band. The band played a tune on the corner of First and Alder and collected a crowd, after which the band marched down the street to the hotel. The old general was called out and made a short speech, which was received with applause. Lane is the only general of the Mexican war who is alive now. Gen. Jas. Shields, who died less than two months ago, left Lane the sole survivor, and it will not be long before he, too, will be placed upon the retired list.
