The greatest cataract in the world is the falls of Niagara, where the water from the great lakes forms a river three-fourths of a mile in width, and then being suddenly contracted, plunges over the rocks to the depth of 175 feet. The greatest cave in the world is the Mammoth Cave of Kentucky, where one can take a voyage in a subterranean river and catch fish without eyes. The greatest river in the world is the Mississippi, 4000 miles long. The largest valley in the world is the valley of the Mississippi. It contains 5,000,000 square miles, and is one of the most fertile regions on the globe. The greatest city park in the world is in Philadelphia. It contains 2700 acres. The greatest grain port in the world is in Chicago. The largest lake in the world is Lake Superior, which is truly an inland sea, being 430 miles long and 1000 feet deep. The longest railroad at present is the Pacific Railroad, 3000 miles in length. The greatest mass of solid iron in the world is the Pilot Knob of Missouri. It is 250 feet high and two miles in circuit. The best specimen of Grecian architecture in the world is the Girard college for orphans, Philadelphia. The largest aqueduct in the world is the Croton aqueduct New York. Its length is 40 1/2 miles, and cost \$12,500,000. The largest deposits of anthracite coal in the world are in Pennsylvania, the mines of which supply the market with millions of tons annually and appear to be inexhaustible.

The immediate importance of the decision by the supreme court on the Thurman bill against the Central Pacific Railroad, is that it catches about \$4,000,000 net earnings accrued since the passage of the law, and compels it to pass into the treasury of the United States as a sinking fund. Hereafter, unless some weak or corrupt congress shall repeal the law, the public will have the satisfaction of knowing that the railway companies are at least making some provision for the payment of the principal and interest of their debt to the government, though that has never been the purpose and intention of the companies.
