

Receipt for Making a Live Town.

1. Sell your business lots at reasonable prices.
2. If you can afford to do so, donate a building lot for some large business enterprise, and thereby enhance the value of town property.
3. Induce business men to locate in your own town.
4. Patronize the business men of your own town.
5. Always sum up your expenses when you visit places outside your own town to buy goods.
6. Speak well of worthy public enterprise.
7. If anything should be undertaken that may be of benefit to the town, do not speak ill of it to others because you happen to be prejudiced against it.
8. Speak well to strangers of your town and its people.
9. If you have any surplus money do not invest it in far off speculation, but give yourself and your town the benefit of it by establishing some profitable factory.
10. Encourage your local newspaper by subscribing for it, advertising in and paying for it.

TO KILL A TOWN.

1. To put no more buildings than you can occupy yourself.
2. If you have an empty building to rent, demand three times its value.
3. Look sorrowful, be little, and insult every new come; give the cold shoulder to, and underrate every mechanic and professional man that desires to come among you.
4. Go abroad for your goods and wares. By no means purchase from your own merchants and manufacturers, even at the same price or less.
5. Finally, give a thorough finish to your work by working against your local paper. Bemoan everybody connected with it; refuse to subscribe or advertise in it, so that persons living at a distance will not know that any business is being done in your town, or they may want to come and settle among you, or buy something from you and that would give you trouble.—Exchange.

LAMB STEWED WITH GREEN PEAS.—Cut the scrag or breast of lamb in pieces and put it into a stew-pan with just enough water to cover it. Cover it closely and let it stew for twenty minutes. Take off the scum; add a tablespoonful of salt add a quart of shelled peas; cover and let them stew for half an hour; mix a tablespoonful of flour and butter and stir in; let it simmer ten minutes; then serve. If you mix the flour with cream it makes it better. Would recommend this recipe to our friends who keep bachelors' hall. Veal is nice cooked in the same way, with half a dozen small new potatoes added with the peas.

GERMAN PICKLES.—Take two or three dozen pickles (good sized ones), half a peck of small grape leaves and some dill; wash the pickles and leaves; take a small jar and lay in the bottom of it a layer of leaves and then of pickles, and a little dill; lay in alternate layers; make a salt water brine of very warm water enough to cover the pickles; do not make it too salty; put a pickle in the jar, and lay on it a heavy stone. In about a week the pickles will be sour. Try but a few for the first time; you may like them and you may not. I think they are very nice.
