

Will Sheep Pay?

G. W. Hawver of this township has demonstrated the fact that a small number of sheep can be profitably handled on most farms, or at least wherever there are conveniences and the disposition to take care for them. Commencing sometime in January, he purchased from time to time, as opportunity presented, until he had a flock of fifty-three. The lambs dropped numbered thirty-seven, and the wool-clip weighed 446½ pounds, which was sold for 24 cents per pound, amounting to \$107 16. The lambs he can sell from time to time, and with the price received for them and the wool he estimates he will have within \$16 of the amount the 53 sheep cost him, and he will have the full number on hand. He was careful in his purchases, buying only those he wanted, and paying for a few as high as \$5 per head. We would like to hear from some more of our sheep raisers as to their experiences, not only concerning the profits, but also regarding care, etc.—Exchange.

LONG BRANCH MILK POTATOES.—Take good, sound potatoes, cut them in slices (raw) and put the milk, according to the quantity you wish to make, in a pudding dish; then after you have put the potatoes in the milk, put it in the oven for about twenty minutes; then take out and put potatoes, with the same milk, into a saucepan to boil until done; season before you put them to boil.

CELERY PICKLES.—Take good sized cucumbers, slice thin, cross-grain, on a vegetable cutter and let stand over night in a weak brine, then drain; take enough vinegar to cover them and put on the stove, and to a gallon of vinegar put a quarter of a pound of celery seed and a quarter of a pound of white mustard seed; boil half an hour and pour over the pickles; put a weight on them.
