AT PRAIRIE CITY.

On last Tuesday morning after the family of Mr. Rulison and our own had seated themselves in one of those fine thoroughbreds of Wood & Church's we "mounted the box", pulled the ribbons and were off for Prairie City. After a pleasant drive of a few hours we "pulled up" at the Hardman House and after our valuable load were placed on solid footing we drove to the livery stable of Le Brette's where the horses were well cared for. Of course we took a walk around to see how our advertisers were, and found Le Brette in the Post Office building with a well selected stock of general merchandise and doing a good business. Mr. Golden was very busy at his shop, in fact he said he had to turn off a portion of the work. He makes fine boots and shoes. At Mrs. Cleaver's we found her busily engaged serving customers, from her well selected stock of ladies goods. Dr. Dodson seemed to be contented. At the store of Laurance & Shearer we noticed a house full of buyers and consequently we did not bother them long. All of the other business men were at work. We noticed quite a number of new buildings in course of erection.

From Mr. Shearer we learned that the contracts at the Malheur Agency were let as follows: The beef to H. Reeves at \$1.44. Flour to Mary Richardson, at \$4.50. No bacon or grain let.

Mr. Hardman has returned from Nevada where he has been for the past six years.

The public school is well attended by clean, orderly and intelligent pupils.

We started for home at 3 o'clock, and on the road noticed the threshers busily engaged on the grain stacks belonging to Mr. Buckingham. At the Hall Brothers' ranch were a large band of calves receiving their brands. The mill at John Day is nearing completion and is a fine building. "Tony" Hackeney was very busy and Frank McCallum was as accommodating as ever, while Thos. Howard was in his glory having opened up business the Sunday previous. A few minutes drive from John Day and we are again at home. Consulting the regulator we find the time consumed in driving the last 18 miles was 2 hours and 20 minutes.

Mr. BLACKWELL, of Long Creek, called on us a few days ago, and from him we learn that the people in that section are going to have a grist mill; that about \$700 is already subscribed and that the people are doing all in their power to secure the mill. A store is soon to be opened there; the building is in course of erection and goods are ordered. A blacksmith shop is soon to be in operation. They need a Post-Office.

ACCIDENT.—On last Monday a man by the name of Kocher, who was employed at W. S. Southworth's Saw Mill, by some means got his hand in the way of the saw and had two of his fingers sawed off and one broke. Mr. Kocher and family lately came from Kansas to this place for his health.
