Indians.

The Indians and some person, name not mentioned, had a pow-wow at Winnemucca, on the 4th inst, in which a number of Indians, natives of California, Nevada and other places, took part and expressed as a desire not to go to Malheur Reservation. Most of the Piutes, including old Winnemucca, seemed to be willing to return provided Leggins and Lee were sent back from the Yakima. Now, we are of the opinion, judging from the tone of the report of the pow-wow, that the people of Nevada are very anxious to retain the Indians in that section, as roving citizens for personal gain or otherwise, and that the Indians are misinformed in regard to many things. We know nothing about how they fared while at the Agency except what we hear from parties who pretend to know, and they say that the Indians were well fed and well cared for. One thing certain supplies were plenty and they got them. It is a well known fact that there is now an abundance of provision, flour, blankets, etc., etc., at the Agency and thousands of pounds on the road there. Now, if the Government does not intend to put the Indians on the Reserve why in the name of all that is good do they continually send supplies here. To tell the truth there is a "nigger in the wood pile" some place and the Government officials know how he got there, and what he is there for. It is a close secret. It appears bad to be parleying with a band of roving red devils the way these Piutes have been dealt with for the last year and the sooner the authorities put them on the Reservation, or throw the land open for settlement, the better it will be for all parties concerned. We believe it is the intention of the government to make the Malheur a very large Reservation, else they would surely shut off supplies soon.

Mr. A. Noltner, of the Portland Standard, gives a glowing description of his visit to Eastern Oregon. But we hope he will be able to get to Grant County next time and see the finest county in this part of the State. The Oregonian should send a man up into the John Day valley to see the people and country, as the weekly has a very large list of subscribers here. Come up, Bro. Scott!

We take the following from the Standard:

"A GREAT EMPIRE—No one can realize the magnitude and extent of the agricultural resources of Eastern Oregon and Washington Territory from the reports published in the papers. In fact, the imagination can hardly conceive the fact that a section of country, which, four or five years ago was regarded as only fit for stock raising, to-day with less than a population of fifty thousand souls, exports from sixty to seventy thousand tons of wheat. This section of the great Northwest has developed much faster than any part of the Pacific Coast, and the extent of its productive capacity is scarcely known. There is sufficient territory to support a population of five millions. There is an empire belonging to Oregon and Washington Territory, east of the mountains, which, within five years will furnish more wheat for export than today goes out of the Golden Gate in California. Another year will do more to develop Eastern Oregon and Washington than the past ten, and shippers will keep up with the demands of the producers."

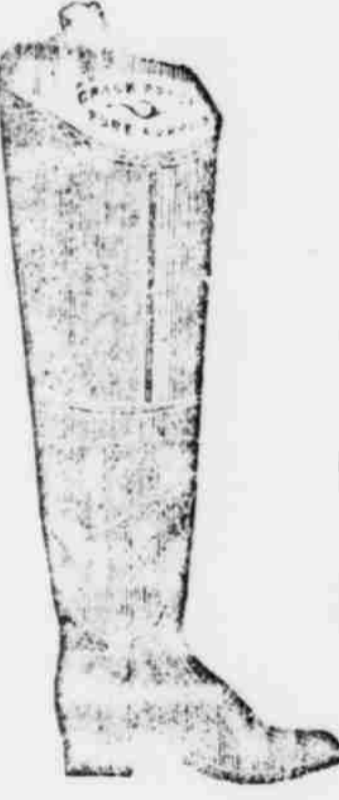

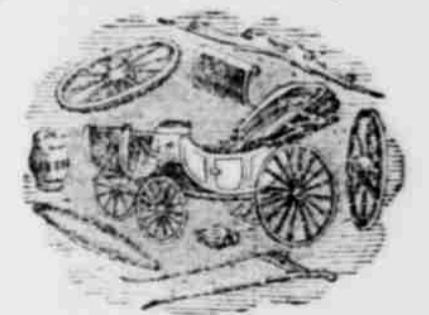
