Indians

THE Indians and some person, name not mentioned, had a pow-wow at Winnumber of Indians, natives of California, Nevada and other places, took part and expressed as a desire not to go to Malheur Reservation. Most of the Piutes, including old Winnemucca. seemed to be willing to return provided Leggins and lee were sent back from the Yakima. Now, we are of the opinion, judging from the tone of the report of the pow-wow, that the people of Nevada are very anxious to retain the Indians in that section, as roving citiizens for personal gain or otherwise, and that the Indians are misinformed in regard to many things. We know nothing about how they fared while at the Agency except what we hear from parties who preteed to know, and they say that the Indians were well fed and well cated for. One thing certain supplies were plenty and they got them. It is a well known fact that there is now an abundance of provision, flour, blankets, etc., at the Agency and thousands of pounds on the road there. Now, if the Government does not intend to put the Indians on the Reserve why in the name of all that is good do they continually send supplies here. To tell the truth there is a "nigger in the wood pile" some place and the Government officials know how he got there, and what he is there for. It is a close secret. It appears had to be parleying with a band of roving red devils the way these Piutes have been dealt with for the last year and the sooner the authorities put them on the Reservation, or throw the land open for settlement, the better it will be for all parties concerned. We believe it is the intention of the government to make the Malheur a very large Reservation, else they would surely shut off supplies soon.

This section of the great Northwest has developed much faster than any part of the Pacific Coast, and the extent of its productive capacity is scarcely known. There is sufficient territory to support a population of five millions. 
