HANDLE SHEEP CENTLY .- Not even a cow, says the Western Rural, should receive gentler handling than the sheep. Kindness is well repaid by any of our domestic animals, but the sheep being so shy an animal, it requires especial exhibition or kindnes. It should be so handled and treated that it never be frightened at the approach of a person. Their treatment should be such that they will netually learn to entertain an affection for the r keeper, and it they do they will naturally be tame and docile. A flock of wild sheep is about the most upprof able investment that farmers can make. They are continually getting into trooble, and causing great annoyance, if not loss to their owner. We have seen some flockmen jump into a flock and pull and baul the sheep by the wool, until the anima's were not only half frightened to death, but received great injury otherwise. A sheep should never be caught or lifted by the weel. Some one has said that if any one doubts the propriety of lifting sheep by the wool, let him permit himself to be lifted by the bair, and it is a good suggesti n. the skin in some instances is actually torn from the flesh, and if the injury is not to that extent it cannot but eff et the flesh to some degree. Sheep should be lifted by placing the arms ground the body and near the fire egs. This is the easiest way to do, especially with large sheep. To catch the animal, the hands should be thrown about the neck or else the sheep should be caught by the hind leg immediately above the heek. This latter may be done with hand or the crook, and when this way is ad opted the atmost gentleness should be observed and the sheep drawn gently back until the other hand can reach the neck. It is scarcely necessary to remind the keeper that when the crook is used upon the sheep, which is closely surrounded by other sheep, that great care must be exercised lest the other sheep jump against the one caught or against the crook, in which case severe damage may be dene.
