THE OGDEN AND PORTLAND ROAD.

A Party Starting Out on the Final Survey.

There has been a good deal said about building a railroad from Ogden, or some point on the Utah Northern, down this valley to the Columbia river. It will be recalled that Col. Thielson, chief engineer of the Oregon roads, came up here about a year ago and made a survey down Boise river from Little Camas Prairie to this city and reported the route practicable, and then went with some of our citizens through Big Camas Prairie and the Wood river country to the terminus of the Utah Northern at Blackfoot, and from there to Ogden to meet J. Gould, of the Union Pacific, and Mr. Villard, of the Oregon roads. He made a favorable report on the whole route from the Columbia river, and gave a careful description of the country, and made an estimate of the probable business that would come to the road. Soon after Mr. Thielson came, Col. Wolcott's surveying party, who started from Ogden and came more directly to Snake river than the route of the Utah Northern, and then through the Wood river country across Big Camas Prairie and down this river to its mouth, then up Willow creek in Oregon via Canyon City to The Dalles. Col. Wolcott and party were sent out in the interest of the U. P. railroad and were out all summer and until late in the fall on this route. On their return they took the line of the old Hudcut survey from this river, and followed it up to the Malad country, in Oneida county. During the past winter we have heard but little about the proposed work on this line either from the West or East. The attractions of J. Gould and other railroad men in the East towards building the Southern Pacific, and of Villard and party in the West, in building roads in the Columbia river valley, lead us to doubt the possibility of their doing much, if anything, on the Ogden and Columbia river road this summer. Matters are, however, presenting a better aspect. Messrs. Virtue and Foster, of Baker City, passed through here on Saturday night and told us that they saw Col. Wolcott in Omaha, and that he was coming on to this route again this summer with another surveying party. We also learn from the Omaha Herald that Col. Wolcott has already started from that place with a party of thirty surveyors to make a final survey of the line of the Ogden & Portland railroad, the preliminary surveys having been made. The Herald says that he will start from the Utah & Northern at Port Neuf Station, 148 miles above Ogden. He will run West to the Wood river district, and from thence to Boise City; thence through Oregon. But the Herald does not say in what direction, whether by Canyon City and the John Day route or up Burnt River and through Powder and Grand River valleys and over the Blue Mountains to Walla Walla.

The Herald very correctly estimates that 400 miles of this route is contiguous to a rich mining country on either side of the road, and also traverses some of the most valuable agricultural lands in Idaho. The Herald says that probably not over 75 or 100 miles will be built this season. This looks as if there was a very fair prospect for starting the road this way from the East and should that be the case the western end will be built over the Blue Mountains this year.—Boise Statesman.
