STATE NEWS.

Judge Savage will build a new double track at the Dalles.

Dalles City post office is now a foreign money order office.

The front prospect, the Mountaineer says, is excellent at White Salmon.

The railway and navigation company have launched two barges at The Dalles.

One of the worst storms of the season on stock was raging at Lake county, the Herald says April 31.

Crops promise an abundant harvest, and stock are thriving in Klickitat county, the Mountaineer says.

Work on the bulkhead at the Cascades is being pushed and it is thought by the contractor that high water will not even stop it.

Mr. J. Ayers has been elected from Lane county grangers to represent them in the state grange which meets in Salem the fourth Tuesday in May.

Mr S. W. Brown has begun the construction of a large saw mill at Vancouver. The bier and engines were shipped recently to Vancouver from Portland.

The people of St. Louis, on French Prairie, have replaced the old Catholic Church with a new structure that will be consecrated by Archbishop Seghers Sunday April 18th.

The Enterprise says the blacksmith shop of Mr. Henry Dubois of Springfield, was burned with its contents, also set of blacksmith tools and set of wagon makers' tools; loss, \$500.

A crook was confined in Dalles jail with two other persons, and in the night he had a frantic term and came near killing the other fellows. It was a scary time for them, but the noise was heard and they were taken out.

Jerome Knox and John Forbes of Paisley, Lake county, went after a bar crippl'd a big grizzly with a lot of cubs, and Forbes undertook to follow her up and got in the creature's clasp and was terribly torn, feigned death and the bear went away.

James Johnson of Cottage Grove, threatened to kill his wife, and she not a precatory threat of her lord and master, wore out a warrant for his arrest. He was placed under bonds of \$500 to keep the peace, and failing to secure the same was remanded to jail where he is now confined.

Considerable interest has been excited in Canyonville by reports of rich gold prospects recently discovered in a gulch near the Tellurium mine. The Plunderer says: Mr. Wm. Worly exhibits a number of nuggets of the size of peas to that of hazel nuts, which he took almost from the surface of the new "find." "Bill" is an old prospector and we hope he has hit it at last.

The State Journal says: Mr. Reid, who for a long time has been engaged in gathering up cattle for the Portland market, came near losing his life last week. He was bringing a bunch of cattle from Siuslaw to Cottage Grove, and among them was a vicious bull. While trying to drive the animal out of the brush, it turned on Mr. Reid and gored him frighfully lacerating his thigh and bruising him up generally.

Treasurer Wright of Roeburg, turned over to the county clerk, Mr. T. R. Sheridan, for cancellation, \$12,243 65 on the 13th, which is the largest amount ever cancelled in the county at one time. This transaction makes \$27,898 09 for the month and gives us an idea of the vast amount of coin which usually passes through county office's hands during the year.
