OUR TRIP.

On last Monday Mr. and Mrs. N. Rubison, Mr. and Mrs. E. E. Turk, the Editor hereof and his better half, S. Sired, H. Stanislawsky and Jas. Aleu boarded the wagon propelled by four gay horses and with that knight of the ribbons, "Josh" Gray on the box seat and our trip to Prairie City to attend the Odd Fellows' Celebration. Nothing unusual occurred on the road up, other than the breaking down of the rear seat and the narrow escape that Messrs. Turk, Stanislawsky and Sired had from being thrown out. After rearranging the seat we took up the line of travel and long before noon were in Prairie City. After securing comfortable rooms at the several different hotels, for our wives, we, that is the candidates proceeded to give all the boys a friendly shake, or perchance a "smile."

About twelve o'clock the members of the order assembled at the hall of Mountain View Lodge, and after a social chat of an hour, dinner was announced and the members repaired to the hotel of J. W. Mack, where tables were set for the accommodation of 67 people. After dinner the members of Mountain View Lodge assembled at their Lodge Room closed the exercises in regular and marched to Grand hall where the visiting brothers were in waiting to be escorted to the hall to hear the oration. Chas. W. Parrish, of this city, delivered a very fine oration and people who were opposed to Odd Fellows heard some truths presented that may in future do them some good.

The music was excellent, and in fact it was an enjoyable day for all there present.

At night a ball was given at Grange Hall and was well attended. Fifty-five tickets were sold. It seemed to be the desire of the floor managers to have all enjoy the event. Many good dances appeared on the floor and all were merry as a marriage bell till early dawn.

The next morning we returned home, each vowing with the other that Prairie City is the place to go for downright fun and enjoyment.

We noticed W. S. Southworth, J. J. Wash, Dr. Boley, E. Hall, A. H. Groth and a host of others from our town at the celebration; also Mrs. and Miss Cattanah, Miss Hazlett, Miss Perrier, Miss Luce and sister, G. I. Hazlett, A. Hacheny and others from John Day.

A correspondent of the San Francisco Call, writing from Fort McDermitt, in the northern part of this county, says: "We are having some Indian excitement in this vicinity just now over a rumored outbreak this Spring of the Putes, and quite a number of families of the Putes have left their homes and come in here for protection. Mr. Brown, of Oregon Canyon, twenty-eight miles north of here, was warned by friendly Indians to leave, and he has brought his own and his son's families here. Mr. Brown reports seeing Indian signals on St. in Mountain the night before he left. Two of the post traders' nephews and one other man living on the mountain, eight miles from here, came in yesterday, quite scared, and are afraid to go back. Indians who have worked around here for several years, suddenly, as if in obedience to some signal, began to pack up and to go to the mountains. The Indians are supposed to be Putes and Umattlas, and it is rumored are being led by a white man. Reports are around that the Duck Valley Reservation Indians have murdered two families near Mountain City, about forty miles from the

reservation. I think you may look for some lively times in this section before another month. The Indians have never seemed so restless as they are now." —Silver State.
