Below we give the Official returns of this county as to the total vote as well as the majorities. Being rushed so this week prevents us from giving the count by precincts.

D. Bailey for Dist. Atty. on Democratic ticket has 413 votes. J. Magone for Republican Senator from this county has 417 votes.

For Representatives.

J. J. Worcester 453, E. Schutz 410. Worcester, Republican, is elected by 43 majority.

For Sheriff.

J. J. Wash 500, Fred Winegar 375. Wash receives the majority to a vote that he did two years ago that is 125.

For Clerk.

W. S. Southworth 436, N. Rulison 437. Rulison has a majority of 1.

For Treasurer.

Jas. Robinson 409, N. Boley 416, Boley's majority 52.

For Assessor.

John Luce 418, John Marshall 433. Marshall has 20 majority.

For County Commissioners.

R. E. Damon 436, A. L. Thompson 438, J. H. Hamilton 436, T. H. Meadow 408. Hamilton is elected by 58 majority, and Thompson by 2.

School Superintendent.

Jas Mack 446, Geo. Rigdon 423. Mack's majority is 20.

For Surveyor.

H. Kelly 430, J. McFarland 438. McFarland is Surveyor by 8 votes.

For Coroner.

Dr. O. M. Dodson 579, Dr. F. Pruden 390. A majority of 89 for Dodson.

From the above it will be seen that the Democrats elect Sheriff, Assessor, School Supt., and one Commissioner, also Surveyor.

The Republicans elect Representative, Clerk, Treasurer, one Commissioner and Coroner.

There is some difficulty about the returns from Marysville. Since the above figures were put in type we learn that owing to a mistake of the Clerk of Election for the above precinct 7 votes instead of 17 were returned for Rulison, hence the board found 9 majority for Southworth instead of 1 for Rulison; and issued a certificate to Southworth. Geo. McHale, Mr. Maxy, Phil Metschan and Mr. S. Hellman, constituted the returning board.

897 votes were cast in the county.

Grant County is the only county in Eastern Oregon that gave a majority against Kelly and Prim.

Naches informs us that the Piute captains have been taking the census of their tribe in Northern Nevada, and gives the following as the result: From Brown's Station on the railroad—including Winnemucca—to Fort McDermitt, there are 608 Piute Indians. At the sink of Carson there are 240; in Virginia City and Carson, 391; from Carson to Walker River, inclusive, 1,507. Wadsworth, Reno and Pyramid Lake Reservation, 291; Honey Lake Valley, 36, and Surprise Valley and Fort Bidwell, 72. Making a total of 2,965 Piutes. This enumeration does not include the Piutes in the southern part of the State, nor the mixed Piutes and Shoshones in this part of the county.—Silver State.

The Astorian says: It is more than probable that two fishermen lost their lives yesterday morning. Drayman, who was saved by the Mary Taylor, asserts that he saw a light in another boat about an hour before daylight. The last he saw of it was close to the whistling buoy, and shortly afterwards he began breaking heavily and they must have drifted, he says, where no power on earth could save them.

Saturday evening seven large houses arrived at Tacoma from Portland, on their way to British Columbia. They went down the sound the next evening on the steamer, and comprise the second lot of about 300 to be forwarded to Mr. Odetto, the contractor for the building of the Canadian Pacific Railroad.
