### HARNEY ITEMS.

Fort Harney, July 5th, 1880.

EDITOR NEWS:—Lieut. Sparrow and a detachment of five men are tarrying with us yet. They are awaiting the arrival of transportation from Fort Boise, to haul government stores from here to that place. Upon the arrival of the teams the Lieut will turn over the stores and proceed with his detachment to join his company. Wesley Kennedy, an old veteran who joined Uncle Sam's army at Palo Alto, and has continued in the service ever since, till '77, has been placed in charge of public buildings at a salary of \$75 per month. Mr. K., notwithstanding his thirty years in the army, is remarkably well-preserved. Indeed, it is a common remark amongst ladies at social gatherings here, that he takes the starch out of a great many of the young fellows.

Frank McBean has the rank and emoluments of a lieutenant, but one would imagine from the pompous manner in which he marches through the garrison and orders us poor privates around, that he was nothing less than a brigadier "Leftenant." McBean and a few of us "high privates" are the only citizens that are permitted to occupy government buildings; positive orders being given that nobody else be allowed to occupy them under any circumstance.

Six large bands of cattle, aggregating 22,000 head, passed through this place during the past two weeks, en route to Cheyenne. Nearly all these cattle, with the exception of one band, belonging to Hardin & Taylor, came from the vicinities of Antelope and Prineville, in Wasco county. Owing to the low stage of water and precipitous banks on both sides, considerable difficulty was experienced in gutting the cattle across Selvie's river. Some 20 head of fine steers belonging to the different bands, were lost while effecting a crossing.

Landingville promised us a big blow-out in the shape of a grand ball, on the 4th, and in deference to the wishes of the inhabitants of that gay and festive little burg we refrained from having any celebration here on that day, all intending to go to the ball; but for some reason or other the arrangements fell through and it did not come off. Nobody put out about it, however, except young ladies who had their hair done up in curl papers for two days previous and had eligible young men as partners for the dance.

NOT GUILTY.—The case of the State of Oregon vs. Wm. Wallace, charged with killing Samuel Dodge over two years ago, occupied the attention of court a greater portion of last week. This has been a long contested case. There was a change of venue from Grant to Lake, and from Lake to Wasco. The case went to the jury about 5 o'clock on the afternoon of Friday, and about 10 that night they returned a verdict of not guilty. The attorneys were, for the State, L. B. Ison and Binger Herman, of Roseburg; for the defense, C. W. Parrish, of Canyon City, and J. J. Ballery, of Baker. Mr. Wallace has been under an indictment of murder in the first degree for a long time, and is at last relieved by the verdict of a jury of his peers.—The Dalles Times.

Mr. Magone has gone to Grande Ronde with some mares for the purpose of breeding them to fine stock. Let some fine horses be brought to Grant County.

### General News.

The Republicans of the 15th Ohio Congressional district have nominated General R. R. Dawes for Congress.

Wm. G. Thompson has been nominated for Congressman for the 5th Iowa district by the Republican Convention.

A great fire is raging in Reazin, Russia. Sixty houses are already destroyed and the flames are spreading rapidly.

Scott Bell (colored) was hanged Friday at Starkville, Miss., for the murder of Jas. Henry (colored) on the 15th of May last.

The Turkish ministry has presented to Premier Caroll a note protesting against the decisions of the Berlin Conference.

It is stated that the monks of Le-grande Chartreuse, manufacturers of the famous Chartreuse liqueur, will not be interfered with.

The board of Directors of the Central Pacific R. R. Co. have declared a semi-annual dividend—three per cent., payable on August 15th.

Darby trotted at Columbus, Ohio, on Friday against the time Rarus made there last year. The horse made a mile in 2:18½. Rarus's time was 2:17½.

Mule trains are passing into the Skagit-mines by the Hope route. The trails are reported in good order and as soon as the water goes down, a rush is expected.

Gen. J. B. Weaver, Greenback candidate for President, has written a letter of over a column, in which he expresses the intention of taking the stump in behalf of his party.

Ayoub Khan, with his entire force from Herat, reached Farah a week ago. A column of all arms will move hence on Gushicki immediately to support the governor of Candahar.

English Carter, alias T. B. Jones, was hanged at Huntsville, Texas, on Friday, for the murder of W. K. Spaulding in July last, near the town Dodge. He met with his fate firmly.

A great meeting of cotton operatives of Mo-eley last week resolved to continue their strike. Several large employers threaten, if the dispute is not settled to close their mills entirely for a month.

Advices received at the Merchant's Exchange from New York, report that the German bark V. s. n, from Newcastle, England, to San Francisco, was totally wrecked on the coast of Patagonia, June 3d.

Two miners, Duncan A. Bethune and John Abbott, were instantly killed in the Union shaft Friday morning by the falling of a wall plate, which slipped from the 900 foot level and struck the men at the 2,500 foot level.

Mary O'Conner, of Jersey City, killed her children during Friday night. Mrs. O'Conner has been sick for a long time and has been unable to care for her children, and she thought by killing them they would go to heaven.

The Spanish Government has granted numerous applications for permission to establish in Madrid, and many parts of the peninsula, monasteries and Jesuit colleges. Sympathy is shown for the Jesuits by the court aristocracy and all classes of society.

The Department of State has received a dispatch from the Minister of the United States at the City of Mexico in relation to the projected railroads in that Republic, which states that the subject has lately seriously engaged the attention of the Mexican people and Congress, and it can not but correspondingly interest capitalists of the United States, for they will probably be called upon to furnish means for these enterprises.

It is said that the Reading R. R. Co. have made preparations and have money to pay \$85,963 interest on their first mortgage bonds, and have also furnished their leased lines with all the money due to July 1st. They are also prepared to meet all dividends on their leased lines falling due during the month, which amounts to \$600,000, and have provided about \$1,500,000 to meet interest and dividends falling due during July.
