ROBBERY ON THE ROAP.

A Well Concocted Plan which Proves A Failure

And Results in the Arrest of H. C. Paige, of Baker City.

f From the Standard, July 18th.] On Sunday morning la t, when Joe Looney, the driver of the stage run ning between the towns of Pendleton and Umatilla, in Umatilla county, arrived at the latter place and delivered Wells, Fargo & Co's treasure box to discovery was made that, although the box was properly locked, the money, gold dust and other valuables, together with the way bills, known to have been in the box when the stage left Pendie ton had masteriously disappeared. A rapid investigation followed; mail sacks and freight in the stage "boot" were taken out, but the only success crowning the efforts of the agent and driver to find the lost treasure was the discovery of a package of gold dust lying at the bottom of the "boot." This, however, was a clue, and showed conclusively that the box had been vifled of its contents while in transit from Pendleten, and other circumstances combired to faster the theft upon a man whe had hitherto been of good character, and who for years was held in the highest esteem by the officers and agents of Wells, Fargo & fo. upon the Pacific Coast. When the stage left Pendleten there were two passengers aboard, one, H. C Paige, of Bake City, formerly the agent of the company at that place; the other, a way pessenger, who left at the Twelve-Mile House. Mr. Prige occupied the outside seat with the driver, and when the way pass uger had arrived at his disci nation.

PAIGE COMPLAINED OF BRING SLEEPY And overcome with fatigue, and crawled into the "boot" to take a nap. The treasure box is always k.p. in the "boot," beneath the driver's feet; but Looney, the driver, being well acquainted with his presenger, and knowing him to have been agent of the company for years never succeeted anothing wrong, and did what he could to make him comfortable while sleeping. Arriving at Umatill , when the robbery was discov ered, Paige was naturally suspicioned, but nothing was said, and he proceeded on his way, while the agent lost no time in communicating the facts to Mr. C. D Barstow, general traveiling superintendent of the company for the Pacific Coa-t. who immed etely telegraphed to Col. Dudley Evans, the out for Paige and not let him get away. Chief of Police Larpeus was also informed of the robbery by telegraph. and detectives Hudson and Day were ducted until a year ago, when he was detailed to work up the case. Paige arrived in this city on Tuesday afternoon and put up at the Holton House, and from the time he stepped off the boat until the moment of his arrest he has been shadowed night and day by the detectives who scarcely slept until sufficient evidence had been proved to warrant an arrest. AND SEVERAL SACES OF GOLD DUST, And the fact that Paige had meney o the same de-cription on his arrival in this city makes it look dark for him. Detectives Hudson and Day found where he had purchased two watches one of which he was wearing when arrested and the other was still at the jeweler's having the initials of a person to whom he intended givi g it to, engraved on the case. He is widely known, having been employed by Wells, Fargo & Co., for many years in various capacities, and was Superintendent of this district three years ago, when he was relieved and given charge of the company's office at Baker City. Paige s well-known throughout the State, and in his espacity as agent of the company it was through his instrumentality that a number of road agents,
