RETURNED.—Detective Hudson returned to the city last evening from Pendleton, where he went to appear as a witness for the prosecution against H. C. Paige, arrested in this city for the robbery of Wells, Fargo's treasure box. Paige was well pleased on being taken to Pendleton for trial, and it is thought he will be able to procure bail. He waived a preliminary examination but several witnesses for the prosecution gave their testimony to the Court for the purpose of perpetuating it for production at the trial. It has also developed that on examining the contents of a box left by Paige at a house in Umatilla a full set of Wells, Fargo's treasure box keys, with the exception of the one opening the box that was rifled, was found. The State Circuit Court of Umatilla county will convene on the third Monday of October, at which term Paige will probably be tried.—Standard.
