### HARNEY ITEMS.

FORT HARNEY, AUG. 29th, 1880. EDITOR NEWS :- The communication of "Citizen," a recent issue of the NEWS, in reference to the proposed new road between here and Canyon City was timely and to the point.

The new road will lessen the distance between these points ten or twelve miles; it is over an easy grade to Selvies Valley and it will never be obstructed by snowdrifts in Winter as the old road has always been. The idiot who laid out the old road displayed his engineering skill (or rather his lack of it) by selecting the highest summits over which to run it, neither looking to the right or left to see where an easy grade could be found or a cut off made.

Mr. Stauffer, of the firm of Barrott & Stauffer, of Winnemucca, who are largely interested in cattle in this Valley has been here for the past two weeks looking after his interests. Mr. S. has also an interest in cattle in Selvie's Valley. He informed us that should the trespass law be enforced on the Reservation J. VAN BEURDEN land this year he would drive his cattle somewhere else, as it would be out of the question to herd them off and he could not afford to pay tribute to the Piute nation for the privilege of grazing them. There are a great many others who will follow his example. Stockmen find plenty of uses for their money besides giving it to those lazy vagabonds to play freeze-out for it. Immense bands of beef cattle are being driven to the Railroad just now from this section. J. F. Burns, Todhunter & Devine and Mr. 3weetser are amongst those who have large bands on the road. . The latter gentleman informed us that he found 250 head of beef in his band of stock cattle in Selvies Valley, notwithstanding Mr. McBean's repeated assertions that there were not 300 head of cattle in the entire Valley. 


