On removing some rock found two skeletons of Indians; on close examination I found one of them had been shot through the skull, the ball entered the back of the head and came out on the right side just forward of the ear. The other was shot through the back bone in range of the heart. I have no doubt but that they are the bones of the two Indians that J. S. Cummings shot soon after the Indians went through that part of the country two years ago. Cummings told some of his friends that he saw two sick siwashes up his creek, but it was not believed by some, but finding those two and being shot as he said he shot them, there remains no doubt in my mind but what he killed them, and very likely many more."


