Of course our friend will remember that the administration takes care of the Indian children and that it is not to be supposed for an instant that Carl Schurtz or any of the parties now in power to look to any other children as the "poor Indian" must be educated so they can shoot and steal to perfection.

Besides the Indians may possibly come back and it will be handy to have 15 or 20 books apiece for them so they can have some wadding and so on. When our citizens are able to see the Reservation thrown open and from 100 to 150 nice good farms in a high state of cultivation instead of a set of raving red devils, then perhaps our frontier settlers can procure books for their children. We understand that in all probability the reservation will be thrown open for settlement next Spring as an invoice is being taken of the goods now at the Agency.

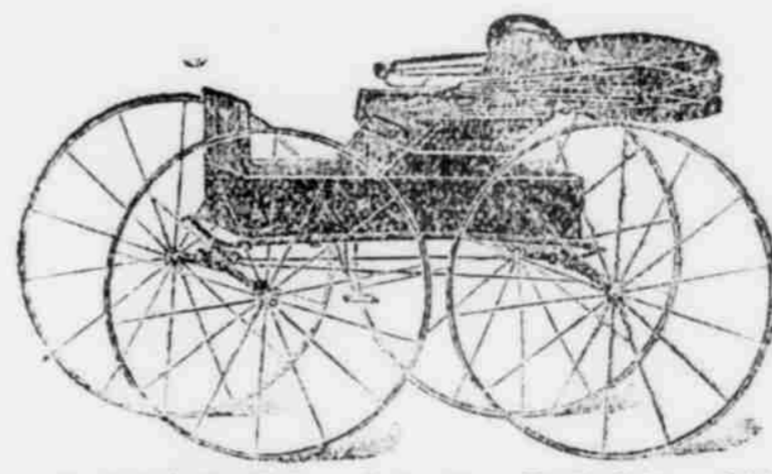

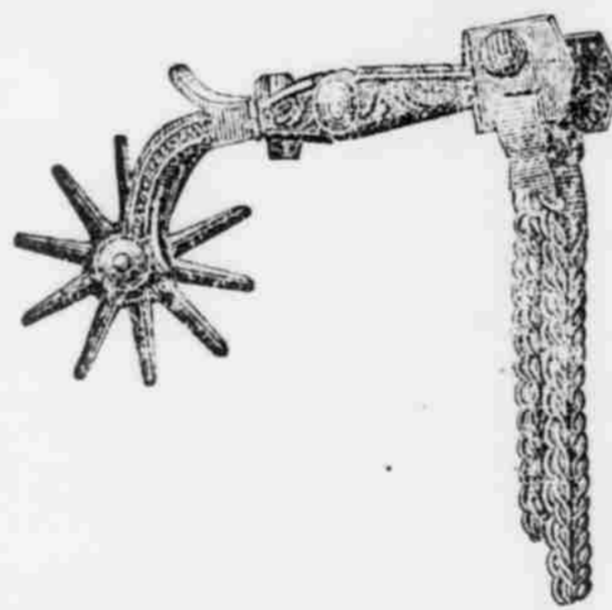

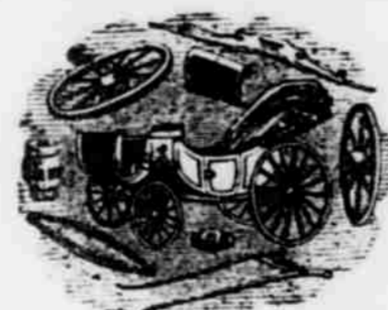
