

A special dispatch received from Eugene at 10 o'clock this A. M., reports a large fire in progress at that place. The Astor House was in flames with no possibility of its salvation. This building is surrounded on three sides by frame structures, to which it was apprehended the fire would spread. The Astor House together with its contents was owned by Mr. Charles Baker and insured for \$8,500. The loss is estimated at \$6,000. A later dispatch to the Bulletin, continues: At 10 A. M. the fire was discovered in the kitchen of the Astor House. It spread rapidly, destroying seven buildings to the North, Messrs. Astor House, \$5,000; B. C. Pennington, \$5,000; Mrs. Wiley, \$300; S. R. Smith, \$500; J. J. Walton, \$1,000; J. R. Brown and F. Rankin, \$3,000; office of the Eugene Guard \$800, insurance, \$500. There was great excitement, plenty of hard work done by the people to save further destruction of property. The blaze raged an hour and a half.
