MARRIED WOMAN'S RIGHTS.

Following was a bill introduced by Senator Humphrey and passed the Legislature and has since become a law:

A Bill For an act to establish and protect the rights of married women. Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

Section 1. All laws which impose or recognize civil disabilities upon a wife which are not imposed or recognized as existing as to the husband, are hereby repealed; provided, that this act shall not confer the right to vote or hold office upon the wife, except as is otherwise provided by law; and for any unjust usurpation of her property or her natural rights, she shall have the same right to appeal in her own name alone to the courts of law or equity for redress that her husband has.

SEC. 2. Henceforth the rights and responsibilities of the parents in the absence of the parents shall be equal, and the mother shall be as fully entitled to the custody and control of the children and their earnings as the father, and in case of the father's death, the mother shall come into as full control of the chil-Iren and their estate as the father does in case of the mother's death. All laws and portions of laws inconsistent with the foregoing are hereby repeale l.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in torce from and after its

approval by the Governor. This is a just and proper law. There is no reason why the wife should not have equal rights with the husband; and in fact, when it comes to a question of guardianship and management of children, the maternal, and not the paternal guar-

dianship, should apply. This law is no manner favors the doctrine of the prancing women suffrigists, but simply emancipiates married women from disabilities that

have heretofore hampered them. There is no vote given to women under this law. They have simply b en given the right to regulate their aff irs the same as a man would do under like circumstances.
