The first six months of 1886 has brought into the State of Oregon 21,575 emigrants.

The Japanese government has ordered 120,000,000 feet of lumber from Oregon mills.

The United States Senate has passed the joint resolution for the consideration by the States of a constitutional amendment extending the President's term from March 4 to April 30 and extending the congressional term to the same extent.

We are pleased, as every friend of education must be, to see the great success attending the State Normal School at Monmouth. Hundreds of teachers who have received training for a longer or shorter time have already gone out to improve the common schools of the State, and we need hundreds more of the same kind.

Journalism in China has its perils. One writer was recently sentenced to be quartered, because in one of his scientific works he enumerated the names of several of the departed Chinese emperors, which is strictly against court etiquette. His punishment was mitigated to decapitation and his children will be executed next autumn.

The fifth volume of California, "Bancroft's Works," will be issued during the latter part of the present month; the terrible loss suffered by the author in the fire of April 30, having checked the publication of his work only temporarily. The volume referred to covers the period of gold discovery in 1849 and will be of very great general, as well as local interest.

In answer to Professor Woodson's stupendous conundrum, "Who was Adam, anyhow?" the Southern Presbyterian General Assembly by a vote of 137 to 13 declared that "Adam and Eve were created body and soul by immediate acts of Almighty power thereby preserving race unity; that Adam's body was directly fashioned by Almighty God, without any natural parentage of any kind, out of matter, previously created of nothing, and that any doctrine at variance therewith is dangerous error."

An important swamp land case has just been decided by the supreme court of Indiana. The suit was that of the State of Indiana vs the Portsmouth Savings Bank. The State claimed to be the owner of the bed of Beaver lake, in Newton county, having acquired a title through "the swamp land act" of 1850. The lake was then a large body of water, but was subsequently drained. Shortly after the passage of the act the swamp lands surrounding the lake were surveyed and conveyed by patents, and since then the purchasers and their grantees have claimed the land under the lake as riparian proprietors. The court holds that the patents for the border tracts did not carry the bed of the lake, but that the same remains the property of the State, and that there has been nothing done by the State to estop it from asserting title to the lands in question.
