Charleston, South Carolina, was badly shaken up by an earthquake last week. Many were killed and injured.

An able-bodied earthquake has been calling on the residents of the Atlantic coast. In Virginia, Georgia, North Carolina, Washington City and Chicago, Illinois, shocks varying from severe to slight. Some of them lasted a minute and a half.

On August 29th, Chicago was shaken up by 140,000 pounds of powder and half as much dynamite exploding about two miles from the extreme western edge of the city. The explosion was caused by lightning striking the powder magazine. One person was killed and several injured.

On the site formerly occupied by the publishing house of A. L. Bancroft & Co., 721, 723 and 725 Market Street, San Francisco, a first-class building is about to be constructed by Mr. H. H. Bancroft, according to the plans furnished by Mr. Clinton Day, architect. The building will be five stories high, 74 feet front by 170 deep, provided with commodious elevators and divided into rooms for mercantile business or suites for professional office.
