The United States land officers are in receipt of a new and important ruling which is the effect that in all final homestead, pre-emption and commutation cases hereafter, where final proof is made subsequent to the date advertised, and within a reasonable time, and the delay is caused by circumstances beyond the control of the claimant, the proof being in other respects satisfactory, the local officer will accept the proof upon claimant furnishing an affidavit explanatory of the delay...
