The latest carpet-bagger which President Cleveland has appointed for this coast is a lawyer from Buffalo, who has been appointed to the land office at Walla Walla. Our neighboring territories have sufficient material to fill their own offices without the aid of Buffalo men, and some of the Democratic papers of Oregon are censuring the course Mr. Cleveland has adopted in importing men for positions of trust.

The last annual report of the Superintendent General of Indian Affairs of the Canadian Government shows that there are now 17,000 Indians in the Northwest under treaty. They have 4,766 acres of land under cultivation, have erected 1,767 houses and own 7,537 head of stock. Last year they erected 108 new houses and fenced in 4,063 acres of land under cultivation. Thirty-six schools have been started by the Government.

The Secretary of War has sent to Congress a tabulated statement of the militia force of the U.S. It shows that at the last returns there were 82 general officers, 1,105 officers of the general staff, 1,638 officers of the regimental field and staff, and 5,385 company officers, a total of 8,210 commissioned officers. There were 18,331 non-commissioned officers, 2,900 musicians and 71,396 privates, making in all 92,697 enlisted men, and a grand total (officers and men) of 100,837 men. The number of men available for military duty (unorganized) is set down at 7,920,768; but in some cases the figures are based upon estimates made in the War Department.
