During the present session of Congress Oregon rivers and harbors have fared better than ever before. Yaquina, one of the most meritorious improvements on the Pacific coast, which received about \$75,000 in 1886, and \$80,000 in 1887, now gets \$120,000, and so on all through the list.

The pension list is now \$85,000,000 a year. If the dependent pension bill becomes a law the annual expenditures will be raised to at least \$100,000,000, and perhaps to one hundred and twenty-five million dollars.

The German Reichstag has just passed to its second reading a bill which increases the strength of the German army by 700,000 men, an increase which will cost the country to begin with about 70,000,000 dollars, not considering the subsequent enormous annual expense.
