HONORS FOR GRANT COUNTY.

The Democratic State Convention has honored Grant County, and it affords us great pleasure to announce through our columns the election of one of Grant County's oldest and most respected citizens to the honorable position of delegate to the National Convention.

Capt. A. W. Waters published a card in the Harney Items of March 28, "soliciting" to be a candidate for Representative, then comes over and has his name brought before the convention which met on April 5. In the meantime, the paper of the 28th ult., did not reach any of its subscribers in the Northern portion of the county until the evening of the 7th. inst. Why was it thus? Will the editor of the Items, or Mr. Waters please rise up and give an explanation, and thus clear up a great mystery, also how a man can be a candidate for office after he has positively declined and given his reasons therefor?
