Senator Mitchell has introduced a bill to protect mail contractors in their rights, from the encroachment of Postmaster-General in annulling them.

Presbyterians in Dubuque, Iowa, have refused to let the Rev. Henry Elliott Marzoff occupy the pulpit because in preaching a funeral sermon on an Unitarian he said that the soul of the dead man would be received in heaven the same as the soul of a Presbyterian. The leading men of the Church think it unsond doctrine.

The fact that the surplus at the end of the fiscal year will exceed \$15,000,000 the estimate made in the Treasury Department is attributable to the increased efficiency of the customs service under Democratic administration. The calculation that would \$110,000,000 as the probable figure of the June surplus made the usual allowance for "the elasticity of revenue." The stoppage of leaks in collections has supplied the extra \$15,000,000. Jacksonville Times.

The tower which is being erected by the Russians on the highest point of the Mount of Olives is already several stories high, but one more is to be added. The object is to make it so high that both the Meliterman and Dead seas may be seen from the top. A number of bells will be placed in the tower. In digging the foundation several christian graves were found, together with an inscription in Greek, in which the word "Stephanus" could yet be deciphered. Ex.

Grand Master T. V. Powderly, of the Knights of Labor, advises the abandonment entirely of the policy of labor strikes. He declares that strikes have never been really successful. Even when special points have been granted, the cost of the enforced idleness has been so great that the laborers have always been the losers. He thinks the line of work to be pursued by the order is the education of the working classes and the amelioration of their condition in other ways than by strikes.
