In its decision the court declares that the constitution is very clear on the matter and that this fact makes it remarkable that the point was never raised before. Many men have been tried for murder a second time, convicted and hanged. The decision was of importance in every state and territory in the United States, and hence it is so interpreted it will certainly follow that courts elsewhere will follow the precedent thus set and declare the same in other states. The matter should be taken to the supreme court of the United States, which has final jurisdiction, and if that tribunal should uphold the Pennsylvania decision, the matter would be at once settled.




