LAWS RELATING TO NEWSPAPERS:

1. Subscribers who do not give
express notice to the contrary are
considered as wishing to continue
their subscriptions.2. If subscribers order the dis-
continuance of their periodicals
the publisher may continue to
send them until all arrears are
paid.3. If subscribers neglect or re-
fuse to take their periodicals from
the office they are directed to, they
are responsible until they settle
their bills, and order their paper
discontinued.4. If subscribers move to other
places without informing the pub-
lishers, and the papers are sent to
former directions they are held
responsible.5. The courts have decided
that refusing to take periodicals
from the office, or removing and
leaving them uncalled for is prima
facie evidence of intentional fraud.6. Any person who receives a
newspaper and makes use of it,
whether he has ordered it or not,
is held in law to be a subscriber.7. If subscribers pay in ad-
vance they are bound to give no-
tice to the publisher at the end of
their term, if they do not wish to
continue taking the paper, other-
wise the publisher is authorized
to send it on and the subscribers
will be responsible until express
notice, with payment of all arrears
is sent to the publisher.

SOCIETY DINING ROOM CONDUCTED.

Notice to Taxpayers.

Whereas, there appears to be a lack of knowl-

edge of the law in regard to the collection of taxes

with a large majority of the Taxpayers of Grant

County I take this method of informing them.

The Statute provides as follows (Hill's Code, page

1301):

It shall be the duty of the Sheriff upon receipt of the Tax Roll from the County Clerk, immediately

thereafter to give notice by posting hand bills, three in each precinct, to the effect that he or his deputy will

attend at the usual place of voting in each precinct in his county, for the purpose of collecting taxes, notice to

be given fifteen days before such meeting and if any person residing in such precinct shall fail to attend at

such time and place and pay his or her taxes such delinquent may pay the same within thirty days at the

County Seat to the Sheriff, and if he fails to pay within the thirty days and the Sheriff visits, his residence

the Sheriff may collect of such person for his own use ten cents per mile going and returning."

The law further provides, page 1306, that:

"The Sheriff shall on the first Monday in April make out a list of the Delinquent Taxes in his County

and return the same to the County Court with an affidavit to be annexed to the same to the effect that such

taxes as are so returned as unpaid and that he has not upon diligent inquiry been able to find any

goods or chattels belonging to persons so returned whereon he could lay the same."

Now I do not propose to take such an oath

without first making an effort to find the property

and if found to sell the same before the first Mon-

day in April to satisfy such taxes.
