Such an alliance of the English-speaking nations, he says, would be able to bid defiance to all Europe and Asia. The United States and Great Britain, having none else to fear might disponse with their two costly navies, and thus take the lead in a general disarmament. Much of this may be regarded, for the present at least, as belonging to the region of Utopia rather than to practieal statesmanship. But com-plete riciprocity between the United States and Canada would be a great stride toward political union, and might lead in the end to a realization of General Butler's hope—a republic embracing the English-speaking peoples of the word.
