Rockwell introduced a bill in the house of representatives to incorporate the National American Woman Suffrage Association, and creating Elizabeth Cady Stanton, Susan B. Anthony, Lucy Stone, Rachel Foster Avery, Alice Stone Blackwell and Jane H. Spofford, a body corporate and politic, with the power of succession, to hold and dispose of property, elect officers and adopt and enforce laws. The object of the association will be to secure the protection of the rights of women citizens of the United States, by appropriate national and state legislation.

A law passed by the Illinois Legislature and which goes into effect on the 1st of July next, entirely prohibits the holding of real estate by foreigners. Alien ownership of land has become a serious evil in several of the Western States, and threatens them with such social disorder as the like cause has created in Ireland. More than 1,000,000 acres of Illinois is owned by foreigners, and under the new law all this property will revert to the state, unless its owners became citizens of the United States before the 1st of next July. Nebraska has also adopted a similar law. United States laws should also forbid the purchase of government land by aliens. Whatever money thus comes to the country does it more harm than good.
