David Prime, the founder of Prineville, died at his home in that city last week.

The county seat contest between Union and La Grange resulted in a victory for the former city.

The vote for two of the county officers was close—in fact too close for the comfort of the candidates.

Cannon is the county seat of Gilliam county, having received a majority of 100 votes over Arlington.

The official canvass of the votes cast in Grant county was had Monday, and the official figures showing the vote in the various precincts are presented to our readers this week.

G. W. McCool, formerly a business man of Prairie City but now of Baker, is in Grant county on a business trip and reports the Baker boom healthy and with the best of prospects of a continuation.

Electron returns from all parts of the State give information that the entire republican state ticket is elected, with the exception of Governor. Penneyver will have a majority of several thousand over his opponent.

The Oregon Pacific may be completed into Eastern Oregon some time in the future, but residents along the line of the proposed road who are any ways advanced in years have about given up all hope of living to witness its completion.

The order of the lower court has been continued by the supreme court in the case of Penneyver, the Baker county member, convicted of murder in the first degree, and Judge Clifford sentenced him to be hanged at Baker City on Friday, July 19th.

We must draw the line at publishing public communications. This of five involved such an one last week, but as the editor happens to know that the persons mentioned therein are not those thieves and the like, the otherwise beautiful poem is not accepted.

The Dalles Southern, which is at present only a railroad on paper, has sent an engineer to view the route from The Dalles to Prineville, and he pronounces the route a practicable one. A corps of surveyors is to be put in the field in about three weeks, when the line will be located as rapidly as possible.

It's all over now and people are willing to settle down to business for the next two years and let an entirely new set of officers conduct the affairs of Grant county. All of them are new hands except commissioner Davis, assessor Timms and treasurer Bailey. Judge and sheriff have "been there" in years gone by.

Harney county came to the front with a majority of 151 for Henry Blackman for joint senator. This, with the 79 majority given him in Morrow county overcame the 210 majority which Grant county rolled up for her candidate, Geo. McHaley, and elects Mr. Blackman to the Oregon senate by a handsome majority.

We are not here to criticize, but the Baker City Blade says "an infuriated bull attacked August Ebell at his ranch and broke one of his arms." The vote of Harney county had not been counted officially at last accounts, therefore the exact situation is not known. Parties over from there, however, report Burns as having the permanent county seat by a small majority.

The people of Drewsey, we are informed, are a unit in favor of leaving the line between Grant and Harney straightened, thereby annexing their portion of country to Grant county. They will doubtless petition the next legislature to that effect.

It is a general remark that stock on the range is in a much better condition now than at any time last season. This is accounted for partly on account of better timeliness, and partly by reason of the range not being over crowded with hungry stock.

The greatest excitement prevailed when John of the Celestial empire was brought forward, and when he folded his ticket in the same lordly way that Napoleon did his dispatches were crestfallen; but it was simply a joke and caused considerable merriment to the perpetrators.—Mountaineer.

Died at his home in Canyon City, Sunday night, June 8, 1890, of dropsy, Mr. J. W. Moody, one of Grant county's pioneers, aged about 50 years. Mr. Moody came to this place with the first discoverers of gold in June, 1832, and had continuously resided here since that time. One by one the old pioneers are embarking to find better prospects in the country beyond, and as they have lived here so their joys will pan out there. The funeral took place from his late residence Tuesday afternoon. He leaves no relatives in this state except his daughter Mrs. John Sollinger, of this city.

Poplar Grove Ranch.

A visit to Poplar Grove Ranch, 34 miles east of town will convince a skeptical person that the lands of Eastern Oregon are worth something, and that the foothill lands of Grant county can be made to blossom and bring forth an abundance for the sustenance of mankind.

Mr. D. R. Rinehart, the owner of this splendid farm, commenced to improve it a few years ago, and is now rewarded for his labor then and for his faith in the soil and climate. In partnership with Mr. Fisk, he planted the Fisk & Rinehart orchard on a gently sloping hillside, consisting of forty acres, and containing about 8000 apple trees. This orchard is now bearing, and is a great source of revenue, for Rinehart's fruit is known all over the country and is purchased at Baker City, after being hauled by wagon across the mountains, a process of fruit shipped from below.

Mr. Rinehart recently purchased the partnership interest in this orchard, and is the sole owner of it, besides a small orchard on his homestead. He has also about 610 acres of land all in one body, the most beautiful feature of which, outside of the orchard, is the timber culture near his residence. This all goes to show what enterprise can accomplish on Grant county's hunchgrass hills.
