In congress last Friday the committee on appropriations were ad dressed by Congressman Morrow, of California, Hermann, of Ores gon, and Bartine, of Nevada, upon the reimbursement of their several states of money expended in extra pay to their state troops during the war of the rebellion. California furnished 15,725 volunteers, Nevada 1180, Oregon 1810. They were intended for service in their respective states to replace the regular troops ordered East in 1801. to participate in the war. The day, Thursday, and Saturday, at 4 Pacific coast volunteers were paid a. m. Arrives at Mitchell on the in greenbacks, which, at that time same day at 8 n clock p. m. were much depreciated, the discount being as high as 60 per cent., and never less than 30 per cent. Thirteen dollars per month paid in currency, was worth about \$8 in gold, which was the standard on the coast. The Pacific states paid an extra allowance of \$5 to each volunteer, thus equaling the pay. The total amount paid by California was \$4,420,891, of this \$1,500,545 was interest and \$468, 976 was for militia, which were rejected, leaving as non-claimed \$2,451,379. The amount paid by Oregon was 8356,271, of this amount \$110,626 was interest on bonds issued by the state, and \$21,118 was for militia. These latter two items have been rejected and there is now claimed for Oregon \$224,526. The amount paid by Nevada was \$404,000, of which \$292,000 has been rejected. The coast representatives show by precedents that the government has reimbursed as principal to all the states which furnished troops the expense expended in many ways for state troops.




