Bishop Wigen, of New York, has sent out a circular letter to the different parishes in his diocese forbidding eulogies at funerals, on the ground that some lives are undeserving of such commendation.

A new apportionment necessarily affecting the electoral college will be made next session by the present congress upon the basis of the census enumeration which will be made this year.

When Senator Sherman delivered his eulogy on the late Hon. S. S. Cox in the Senate last week he was several times affected as to be compelled to stop until he could master his emotion, and yet, when Mr. Cox was living he and Senator Sherman were political enemies.

At the suggestion of the Secretary of Agriculture the State Department has taken a step by which it is hoped to prove to the satisfaction of the British government that no cattle disease exists in the United States to warrant the restrictions on importations imposed in England.

Congress has passed and the president has signed the so called Dependent Pension Act. This act provides, among other things, that all persons who served three months or more in the military or naval service of the United States during the war which ended a quarter of a century ago, and who have been honorably discharged therefrom, and who may hereafter be suffering from a mental or physical disability...

In congress last Friday the committee on appropriations were addressed by Congressman Morrow, of California, Hermann, of Oregon, and Bartine, of Nevada, upon the reimbursement of their several states of money expended in extra pay to their state troops during the war of the rebellion.

PENSIONS.

In the matter of pensions it would seem to be quite time to call a halt. Patriotism was the popular and principal sentiment appealed during the war, since which time it seems to have been ignored entirely, or its responsiveness is so feeble as to be without effect in staying the mad onslaught upon the government treasury.

The soldiers or soldiers' friends seem to have based their present demands upon the entire number engaged in the war, without considering the valued lives of those that laid them down during the conflict.

There is at present about 500,000 upon the pension rolls, and the new bills before congress and already passed, will increase it to 750,000. The annual amount to meet this expenditure will be \$167,000,000, an average of \$18.67 per month, or \$224 per annum for each pensioner.

As the youngest men of the army are now 47 years old, it follows that this amount must rapidly decrease, a generation having passed away since the war. The receipts of the government are estimated at \$450,000,000, so that the pension roll will consume more than one third of the entire income of the government for the present year at least.

It is very well to care for the needy soldier and his family, but now a bill is before congress to grant the widow of Gen. Fremont a pension of \$6000 per annum. Mrs. Lincoln, the Grant's and Garfield's and many others receive from the government sums almost equaling the counties of royalty while the widows of crippled soldiers receive barely enough to keep soul and body together.
