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gold is so minutely fine that a large per centage floated away in the water and never came in contact with the mercury. It was soon found by assay that fully fifty per cent. of the gold was thus lost, or at least remained in the refuse from the crushing battery.

The thousands of tons of tailing from the original battery were treated by this means, and every particle of gold recovered; about three ounces per ton were obtained. Large works have been erected capable of treating 1,000 tons a week, and have been worked successfully for about two years.
