As an instance of the wonderful fecundity of vegetable life, it is said that a single tobacco plant will produce three hundred and sixty thousand seeds.

A CHANGE in the channel of the river Stour, at Sandwich, Eng., has revealed the wreck of a vessel believed to have sunk at that spot during the reign of Henry VIII.

In the ten years after he passes thirty a man's foot grows in length nearly an inch. In the case of a woman, however, her foot is generally smaller at twenty-five than it was when she was eighteen.

DIFFERENT classes of substances have been found to affect the organs of taste in the following order: Bitters, acids, saline substances, sweets and alkalies. The taste nerves are nearly 2,000 times as sensitive to quinine as to sugar.

In each respiration an adult inhales one pint of air; a healthy man respites 16 to 20 times a minute, or 20,000 times a day; a child, 25 to 35 times a minute while standing the adult respiration is 22 times per minute; while lying down, 13.

The manufacture of butter from the marrow of cocoanut is a new but growing industry in Germany. The butter is of a clear, whitish color. The price of this butter is from twelve to fifteen cents per pound. It is suitable for cooking, and is not disagreeable to taste or smell.

A MONSTER egg is exhibited in the museum at Buda-Pesth, Hungary. It is an egg of the prehistoric bird *Archaeopteryx*, and but few museums possess such a specimen; 148 hens' eggs would find room in it, and it would hold nearly nine quarts. It was found in 1850 in Madagascar.
